## <u>Cooke's Hollow - One of Arlington's Best Kept Secrets</u>

Cooke's Hollow on Mystic Street is near the site of Captain George Cooke's grist mill, built in 1637, and later the site of a succession of mills and factories until the early 20th Century.

Cooke's Hollow is a small shady park located on Mystic Street next to the Police Station. It is the location where Mill Brook comes out of the culvert which takes it under the high school and Buzzell Field. The water tumbles down a small waterfall under a foot bridge and flows through the hollow and under Mystic Street towards Meadow Brook Park.

I have been working for the past few years on controlling the knotweed, a member of the buckwheat family introduced into the U.S. from Eastern Asia, which grows along the brook on both sides. The good news is that, since the park is mostly shady, I think the weed can be eliminated. There is also the need for a more general cleanup and, if we get real ambitious, some planting along the brook.

I would like to lead a group from the Garden Club and would designate maybe three work days during the summer. Because of the shade and proximity to the brook, I find it less onerous to work in Cooke's Hollow during the summer than other locations that we maintain in Arlington.
